Issues of particular current importance in Europe include new or impending developments in the areas of ground handling and state aids, and issues which are attracting significant attention for the first time, such as agreements with the United States, technical harmonisation, flags of convenience and cross-border ticketing. The Association's annual conference for 1995 returns to London, where its first annual conference was held in 1989, and will address these issues, as well as any others which may be current at the time. For the first time this year, a dinner for all delegates will be held the evening before (information about which appears on the back page of the programme).
